People stop Rob Caudill in airports for autographs. They stare at him at restaurants. And when he struts on stage, people scream themselves hoarse. Why? Rob is a dead-on Rod Stewart impersonator. With spiked blond hair and leopard-skin coat, the Memphis-based singer has carved out a career re-creating Rod's high-energy show and his greatest hits with uncanny accuracy.

From the age of seventeen people always told Rob he looked like Rod Stewart. After graduating from high school, Rob moved to Memphis to study music at Memphis State University and began playing bass in bands around the city.

As a one-time sessions musician and bass player in an 80's band called the Breaks, Rob got his first break when the band was signed to RCA Records. The Breaks first single "She Wants You" was played in heavy rotation on MTV and caught the eye of Bugle Boy Clothing who used the Breaks for their first commercial on MTV.



After spending time with a few other bands, Rob began doing session work with Joe Walsh of the Eagles and heeded his advice to begin a tribute career as Rod Stewart.

In 1996 Rob put down his bass, bought some wild clothing and studied a lot of Rod Stewart videos to learn the artists' moves and mannerisms. He has been swinging his mic stand and kicking soccer balls into the audience ever since. He has performed all over the world, including performances in China, Malaysia, Japan and Canada.

Rob has been working with the world famous Legends in Concert out of Las Vegas for more than five years. He also works independently doing a high-energy two-hour show and claims, "I've got the greatest job in the world, making a living doing something I love."
